CCA requires a minimum of 21 credits to graduate. Parents are welcome to add family requirements as appropriate. Be clear and concise.

CCA Recommends that Courses be concentrated in the areas of interest to the student or a wide variety if the student is unsure. Be sure to include high school work done prior to high school age.

Be Creative!! Hobbies and work may be worth high school credit.

For example: A Driver's license is an Elective. [30 hours classroom, 60 hours driving = 90 hours!]

Subject areas are broad on Purpose! Choose subject specifics that YOU want to study.

Social Studies is anything about human groups- history, cultures, geography, psychology, sociology, civics, government, etc.

CCA does NOT require specific electives because we believe these should be specific to the student and their goals.

Credit Validation: At your portfolio review show the earned credit based on one of the options from 'what is a credit?'

For example, There are many planners and journals for documenting time, keep the best papers, or take screenshots of grades on a logged in account.

Dual Enrollment- a typical college course = 1 high school credit. A non-credit course is also worth a high school credit. Tutors, classes, co-op, internships, apprenticeships and tutorials are great options for the high school years.

What is a Credit?

An arbitrary determination of a worthwhile amount of work!

Here are some general guidelines, pick ONE method per course:

- 85% completion of a high school or college Textbook.
 - [teachers never cover an entire textbook!]
- 90 hours of work:
 - include research time, reading, watching/listening, writing and doing time
- One 10 page research paper, with at least 3 sources.
- A standardized test that confers credit, such as CLEP. AP.
